

How to Go Green at Work

If you are already taking environmentally friendly steps at home, it's a natural extension to take similar measures at WORK, both to SAVE energy and to create a healthier workspace ENVIRONMENT. Making the ENVIRONMENT more pleasant for yourself, energy efficient and eco-friendly will increase your enjoyment of the workplace and lessen its impact on the environment as a whole. Being energy and resource efficient and conscious of improving the HEALTH and well-being of the work environment will also reduce the costs of running a business. It's time to "go green" at work, and here is how.

More Work, Less Energy

For many people, a computer is the central tool at work. Optimizing the energy settings for computers and other devices can be more than a modest energy saver. Set computers to energy-saving settings and make sure to shut them down when you leave for the day ("standby" settings will continue to draw power even when not in use). By plugging hardware into a power strip with an on/off switch (or a smart power strip), the whole desktop setup can be turned off at once (make sure to power down inkjet printers before killing the power--they need to seal their cartridges). Printers, scanners, and other peripherals that are only used occasionally can be unplugged until they're needed. And of course, turn off lights in spaces that are unoccupied.

International Day for Biological Diversity May 22, 2015 Theme: "Biodiversity for Sustainable Development"

This year's theme reflects the importance of efforts made at all levels to establish a set of Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) as part of the United Nations Post-2015 Development Agenda for the period of 2015-2030 and the relevance of biodiversity for the achievement of sustainable development. The selection of the theme also underlines the adoption of the Gangwon Declaration, by ministers and participants to the High-level Segment of the twelfth meeting of the Conference of the Parties to the Convention on Biological Diversity (CBD). The Gangwon Declaration welcomed the importance given to biodiversity in the outcome document of the Open Working Group on Sustainable Development Goals and called for the further integration and mainstreaming of biodiversity in the Post-2015 Development Agenda.



Environmental Legislation

UAE Law #24 (1999) for PROTECTION AND DEVELOPMENT OF THE ENVIRONMENT

Section 2: The Environment and Sustainable Development

Article 9: All Concerned Parties specially parties responsible for planning, economic and construction development shall consider aspects of protection of the environment, control of pollution and rational use of natural resources when developing economic and social plans and when establishing and executing of projects.

Article 10: The Agency shall, in consultation and coordination with the CompetentAuthorities and Concerned Parties, undertake the preparation, issuance, revision, development and updating measurements and standards of environment protection. The balance between technological capabilities available economic cost shall be considered when determining such measurements and standards without undermining the requirements for the protection of environment and control of pollution.

Regulation No (2) of 2007 For the EPDA - RAK

Regulation Issued on March 08, 2007Article (5): The Authority objectives are:

- Protect and develop the environment of Ras Al Khaimah, and setting the required plans and strategies for protecting it from the negative impacts of the activities that may cause damages to human health, agricultural crops, wildlife, marine life, other natural resources and climate. The Authority shall implement these plans and policies, and taking the necessary actions and applicable procedures to prevent environmental deterioration, combating different environmental pollution through forbidding, and limitation. For the benefit of the present and future generation.
- Sustainable Development of the Emirate, propose the necessary basics to link environmental concerns to the planning and development policy of the entire Emirate, through including the environmental regulations and vital part of the proposed policy for planning, executing, and monitoring of developmental projects that implemented by the government and private institutions through projects environmental impact assessment, coordinating between companies, industries, and other corporate working in industrial, economical fields and other parties concerned with environmental affairs, and civil society organizations in the Emirate.
